CHAPTER 3

CONDITIONAL SENTENCE

Types of Conditional Sentence

1. Conditional sentence type 0

Conditional sentence type 0 or zero conditional is a sentence that is used to tell the

fact.

Examples:

- If it rains, things are wet
- If we heat water, it boils

2. Conditional sentence type I

A first-conditional sentence is a sentence that is possible to be happened in the future. This conditional sentence is connecting the IF CLAUSE and the MAIN CLAUSE with subordinating conjunction 'IF"

Pattern:

COMPLEX SENTENCE	
subordinate clause (if + condition)	main clause (result/consequence)
if + simple present	 simple future (will + bare infinitive) imperative (bare infinitive)

Examples:

- If I win the lottery, I will buy a new house in Bali
- If I study hard in this final examination, I will get a big score.

3. Conditional sentence type II

Conditional Sentences Type II is a sentence that refers to the situation in the present, but the situation is unreal. This sentence is not based on fact, and it refers to unlikely condition with the probable result...(..what happened if.....)

COMPLEX SENTENCE	
subordinate clause (if + condition)	main clause (result/consequence)
if + past tense	Past future (would + bare infinitive)

Examples:

- If I found her address, I would send her an invitation.
 - **Situation:** I would like to send an invitation to my friend. I have looked for her address, but I couldn't find it. So, I think it is rather unlikely that I will eventually find her address.
- If John had the money, he would buy a Ferrari

Situation: I know John for very long time and I really know that he doesn't have much money, but his ambition is buying a Ferrari. But I think it is very unlikely that he will have the money to buy one in the near future.

4. Conditional sentence type III

Conditional Sentences Type III is a sentence that refers to situations in the past. It can be called as "regret" because It might be happened in the past, if the conditions had been fulfilled.

COMPLEX SENTENCE	
subordinate clause (if + condition)	main clause (result/consequence)
if + past perfect	Past future perfect (would +have + V3)

Examples:

- If I had found her address, I would have sent her an invitation.
 Situation: Sometime in the past, I wanted to send an invitation to my friend. I didn't find her address, however. So in the end I didn't send her an invitation.
- If John had had the money, he would have bought a Ferrari.

 Situation: I knew John very well and I know that he never had much money, but he loved Ferraris. He would have loved to own a Ferrari, but he never had the money to buy one.
